A mass covid vaccination drive was conducted for public and students at Nirmala College of Pharmacy, Muvattupuzha on 26th July, 2021 at 2 pm. Administrator Rev. Fr. Jos Mathai Mailadiath inaugurated the vaccine drive and Principal Dr. Badmanabhan R. welcomed the team. The vaccination team involved a total of 8 members which includes a Doctor, 5 Nurses, and 2 Supporting staffs of Holy Family Hospital, Muthalakodam, Thodupuzha. The purpose of this drive was to administer Covid-19 vaccines to a large population to mitigate the spread of the virus and achieve herd immunity. During the vaccination program accurate information and education regarding the vaccines were provides and the concerns of the participants were addressed.
